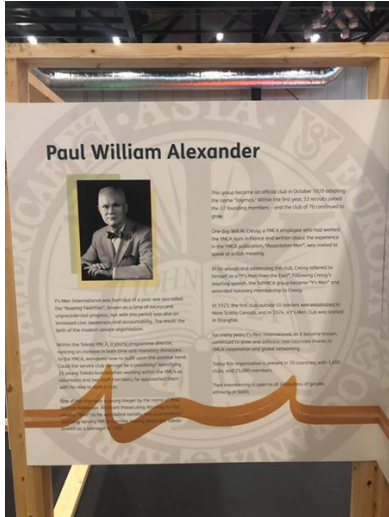
I am honoured to have been part of this great event and I hope that this is only the beginning of many more special and inspiring occasions for YMI in future years.

In the lead up to the event, YMI participated in the corresponding campaign on 8 June 2019, with a number of clubs giving the requested 175 minutes of volunteer service to their communities.

The first International RDE Summit was held in Toledo, Ohio from 14 - 17 November 2019. The event provided training, discussions and workshops for the incoming Regional Directors and Area Presidents in an atmosphere of global fellowship and teamwork. It was attended by close to 100 persons and included a unique tour in/around Toledo tracing the roots of our founder and our movement, as well as showcasing the first successfully completed PWA Legacy projects – installation of a memorial headstone at the grave site of our founder and renaming of a local public park in his honour.

The next event is planned for February 2021 on Jeju Island, South Korea.

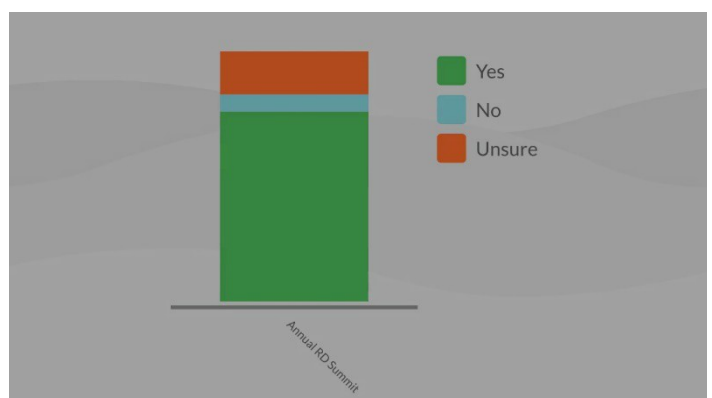

A DIFFERENT WAY TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE

While some service organisations engage only in high-visibility, short campaigns, YMI's Time of Fast programme supports both: small-scale community projects administered entirely at the local level as well as more complex, multi-level engagements with extended reach.

Club members continue to observe the original programme trademark of fasting temporarily (typically in February) and donating the estimated cash equivalent of those stopped meals to TCF in a unique and inspirational fundraising approach that highlights a symbolic solidarity with the less fortunate. Regular contributions, not associated with fasting, are also made throughout the year.

In addition, YMI encourages our club members to visit and look up volunteers or to activate TCF projects for a short period (1 - 6 weeks) and will offer partial travel subsidies, project matching and coordinating services for any member who may be interested in this enriching opportunity.

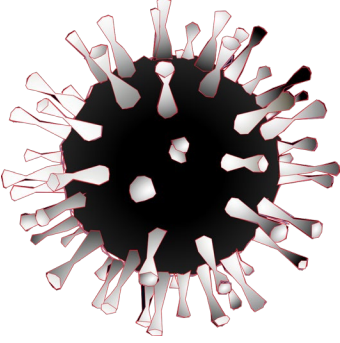

A Brief Introduction to Y'S MEN INTERNATIONAL

COVID-19 Response

2019/20 was a unique year, with club activities and function effected at various levels and times by the novel coronavirus. Below are some of the ways in which YMI responded.



1. Gave special advice and information regarding the virus and prepared related recommendations for club leaders.
2. Held special GTM meeting of APs and RDs.
3. Issued CHF 5 000 from the IP discretionary fund for Area Korea's initiative to distribute face masks.
4. Established a special COVID-19 Emergency Response Fund jointly with Area Korea.
5. Collected and shared stories of club-level action and response through our social media.
6. Recognised essential workers within the YMI family
7. Developed a strategic plan and checklist to face the "New Normal" and shared it with APEs and RDEs.
8. Maintained regular communication with clubs, and where possible club members, and special COVID-19 pages on the website.
9. Extended payment deadlines for international dues and adjusted some calendar deadlines for 2019/20 and 2020/21.

YMI COVID-19 EMERGENCY RESPONSE FUND PROVIDES INTERNATIONAL SUPPORT FOR LOCAL ACTION

Recognising the global health implications of the Coronavirus pandemic and its far-reaching health, economic and social repercussions, an extraordinary small matching-funds grant programme was established by Y's Men International jointly with Area Korea. Established as a gesture of international solidarity in recognition of the community-level engagement and action being taken to help the most vulnerable in this period of crisis and to prevent further transmission of the virus, the following 21 YMI projects were approved for subsidy.

1. Y Service Club South Rowan (USA, South Atlantic Region)

Assisting in food delivery to local seniors through the local "Meals on Wheels" programme and donating financially to the United Way's national effort to combat food insecurity, help with medical expenses, and support other nonprofits struggling because of the lockdown restrictions. More than 100 persons are expected benefit either directly or indirectly.

2. Y's Men and Women's Club Hilo (USA, Hawaii Region)

Supporting the Island of Hawaii YMCA - Day Camp's programme for lower-income essential workers in urgent need of affordable daycare by contributing to camp staff salaries and participant scholarships. The primary beneficiaries are children whose parent(s) are healthcare workers engaged in treating COVID-19 patients

3. Y's Men's Club of Cannanore Metro (IND, West India Region)

Engaging in the country's official "Break the Chain" campaign to limit virus transmission with actions such as the installation of public handwashing facilities near a local bus stop including a billboard of public service information about important personal protective measures to adopt. In a high-traffic, metropolitan area, the number of people directly impacted by the work of YMC Cannanore Metro is expected to exceed 100.

- 4. Y's Men's Club of RAHA Philippines (ASP, Philippines Region)**
Purchasing and distributing gear through official, approved channels Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) Suits to frontline healthcare workers (doctors, nurses, etc.) who do not have access to appropriate protective. The target is 1 000 suits.
- 5. Y's Men's Club of Bangkok (ASP, Southeast Asia Region)**
Distributing approximately 10 000 cloth face masks to residents of two refugee camps at high-risk of infection because of their living conditions.
- 6. Y Service Club of Lumbini Nepal (ASP, Southeast Asia Region)**
Conducting an awareness campaign that includes the distribution of relative literature, as well as providing essential food and protective items (like sanitizer) to low-income families and the disabled. The action is expected to directly impact more than 100 poor people, particularly affected by the lockdown conditions.
- 7. Y's Men Club of Alakode (IND, West India Region)**
Supplying basic food items and washing soap to around 50 poor people during the lockdown.
- 8. Region Maritimes (CAC)**
Contributing essential food items to four food banks in the Region and supporting YMCAs offering shelter and daycare services. An estimated 50 to 100 persons are expected to benefit directly.
- 9. Region Caribbean (CAC)**
Conducting an extensive awareness campaign, including videos and translation in local dialects using social media to reach an estimated 8 000 persons, as well as distributing water to 10 families in the parish of Manchester (Jamaica) which has no natural water source.
- 10. Region Mideast (USA)**
Providing meals for more than 100 school-age children from low-income households in Toledo, Ohio - administered by the Toledo YMCA in conjunction with Toledo Central Y's Men's Club, the United Way, and JCC.
- 11. Region Hawaii (USA)**
Providing financial support for YMCA Honolulu's daycare programmes for children of essential workers. Between 50 and 100 lower-income families requiring childcare due their engagement as key workers during the COVID-19 crisis are expected to benefit.
- 12. Y Service Club of Whittier A.M. (USA, Pacific Southwest Region)**
Giving money to local YMCAs in Whittier, California (working on a reduced income due to the forced closures of their regular gym and exercise activities) to support supplying breakfasts, lunches and weekend food kits to more than 100 lower-income families, focusing on replacing meals usually provided through the public schools (now closed).
- 13. Y's Men Club of Chemperi Town (IND, West India Region)**
Delivering food and water to orphanages, tribal colonies and general poor; installing public handwashing facilities according to the government's "Break the Chain" campaign; supporting the medical community by providing patient transport using the club's two ambulances; and supplying two high-power fogging machines to local fire/rescue teams for disinfecting purposes to the benefit of more than 100 persons.

14. Y's Men's Club of Taliparamba (IND, West India Region)

Purchasing and delivering food and clothing items to more than 100 homeless persons in Taliparamba city using the support of local government agencies.

15. Y's Men's Club of Kakkenchal (IND, West India Region)

Purchasing and distributing 1 000 face masks to general public, sanitisers to government offices, speed breaker boards to police stations, food items to community kitchens and food kits for widows, children and tribal peoples.

16. Y's Men's Club of Pananchery Town (IND, West India Region)

Purchasing and distributing sanitiser, hand wash and face masks in Pananchery Grama Panchayat of Thrissur District benefiting more than 100 health workers, police and COVID-19 volunteers.

17. Y's Men's Club of Peechi (IND, West India Region)

Distributing meals for more than 100 doctors, staff and PG students at the Government District Hospital Thrissur.

18. Y's Men's Club of Mumbai (IND, South India Region)

Purchasing and distributing grains and non-perishable foods to more than 100 migrant communities and daily wage workers.

19. Region South West India (IND)

Purchasing and distributing five nebulisation units, 12 000 disposable face masks and 240 N95 masks to health care workers and organisations in the various Districts, reaching more than 100 persons - primarily medical service providers at various levels.

20. Y Service Club of Ottawa (CAC, Central & Western Canada Regions)

Supplying items such as face masks and children's toys/games to the more than 100 residents of the National Capital Region YM-YWCA Shelter (the only one still operating during the COVID-19 crisis).

21. Y's Men's Club of Sreekandapuram (IND, West India Region)

Supplying essential food items and water to local police stations and through community kitchens within the municipality, distributing COVID-19 educational material to places of worship and other locations.

YMI Statement on COVID-19

In June 2019, YMI issued the following statement.

Y's Men International Expresses Concerns Over Elderly, Poor and Marginalised

Y's Men International is uniting volunteers for social change in 100 communities across 70 countries. For over 98 years, our clubs have been engaging their members to lead a life filled with happiness through friendship, fellowship and service to the community in need. As a worldwide movement, we are leveraging the strength of our combined networks of 26,000 families to provide comfort and hope to those feeling the effects of isolation and fear amidst the COVID-19 pandemic. We are focusing our collective skills, resources and moral strength to support frontline health workers and first responders as they battle this disease and save lives. We are also extending our helping hand to the poor and marginalised whose lives have been affected due to the shutdown of business activities and enforcement of safety measures to combat COVID-19. We are in solidarity with YMCA, our principal partner organisation, in their efforts to build organisational resilience and their commitment to the mission of empowering young people.

Y's Men International is a volunteer-driven association and the vast majority of club members are active senior citizens. While we remain committed, through unprecedented unity, to meeting the challenge of finding innovative ways to take action to help communities around the globe to heal and thrive, our membership has raised concerns over social activity and volunteerism in the realm of COVID-19. How do we continue to uphold the motto of the organisation and 'acknowledge the duty that accompanies every right'?

Y's Men International urges world leaders to find ways:

- a. **To reduce the impact of the digital divide:** The internet and other digital technologies have become a window to the world during the lockdown, enabling us to connect with family, friends and the community. While about one-half of the world's population has internet access, the other half remains offline and disconnected, not just from opportunity to link with others during the pandemic but also from the multitude of resources and opportunities the worldwide web can provide. For many senior persons, the poor and marginalised if they have access to digital services it is limited, and they often lack the necessary skills to fully exploit them. This exacerbates feelings of abandonment and the effects of isolation. ***YMI supports the internet and user-friendly digital technologies being made available to all at affordable prices in the interest of global connectivity, equal opportunity, and social wellbeing.***
- b. **To reduce the impact of physical distancing:** COVID-19 risks aggravating the social exclusion of senior persons through controls restricting movement and contact such as stay-at-home requirements, quarantines, and lockdowns. While such measures are crucial for ensuring the public safety, the realities faced by senior persons must be taken into consideration and care taken not to increase their social isolation and subsequently worsen their health outcomes. YMI can help by creating safe spaces for small groups. ***We advocate for special care for strengthening the mental health and well-being of senior persons who are living alone through regular visitation of service club volunteers / health workers.***

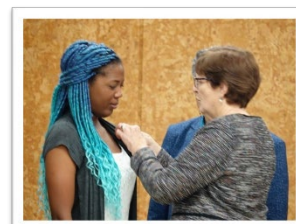

It is crucial to minimise risks by addressing their needs and their rights in our efforts to fight the pandemic. OPERATIONS

International Council Meeting 2019

The Y's Men 2019/20 year began with the International Council Meeting in Sendai, Japan between 14 and 17 July. It was preceded by the one-day training of the incoming Area Presidents led by LTOD Edward Ong. It was followed by the Asia Pacific Area Convention, which was attended by most of the International Council (IC) Members. In addition to the standard review of the reports on our 2018/19 activities and plans for the coming year submitted by our international leaders, there was also time for group work and discussions on meeting our Challenge 22 targets, Paul William Alexander Legacy projects, weighted international voting and the exciting introduction of the proposed RBM partnership with the YMCA, The Global Fund and UK's DFID by special guest D. J. Forza, YMCA Directors of Partnerships and Collaborations. Many legislative items were considered (58 motions in total). More about the decisions taken can be found in the ICM 19 Minutes available to YMI leaders.

To officially open the meeting, IPIP Moon Sang-bong gave to IP Jennifer Jones the Bible and the Gavel, symbolising the transition of the great responsibilities of the International President.

Unexpected Death of IPE & Emergency IPE Elections



On 4 September 2019, it was with utmost grief that we had to announce the unexpected passing of International President Elect, Poul-Henrik Hove Jakobsen. In Armenia for a Y's Men's trip with his club, he was admitted to a hospital in Yerevan due to sudden, unexpected health problems. He underwent emergency surgery there and was apparently recovering when suddenly his health rapidly deteriorated. Despite the best efforts of local medical professionals, he was unable to fight the complications of his illness. The unexpected demise of Poul-Henrik was a huge loss for his family and his wider international Y's Men community. His 27 September funeral at the Aulum Church in Denmark was well attended.

Following the death of Poul-Henrik, the Nominating Committee submitted three candidates to the Regions in order that a new International President-Elect could be selected. In accordance with the International Constitution, Regions were given 30 day to return their ballots. In a well-supported election process, 42 of 43 Regions submitted their votes.

Jacob Kristensen, a retired school principal from Denmark was elected. Jacob joined Y's Men in 1981 and is currently a member of the Y's Men's Club Ringkøbing. He has previously served as an International Council Member (2007 - 2010) and was the Europe Area President in 2010. Jacob has frequently engaged his classroom skills with his work with YMI, notably as the Area Service Director for Leadership Training and Organisational Development (ASD LTOD) in Area Europe since 2012.

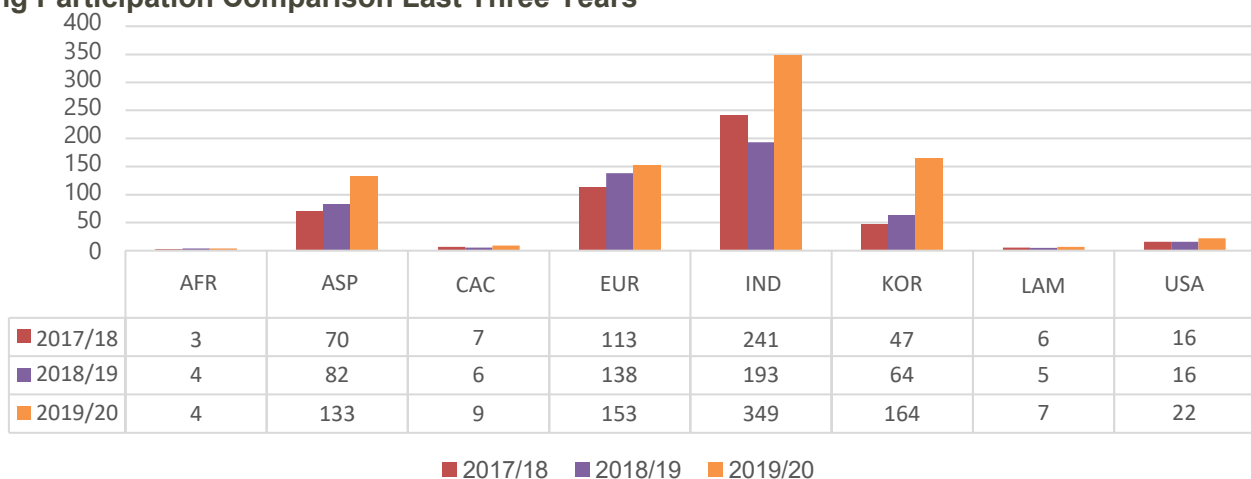

Mid-year Meeting (MYM) 2020

MYM 20 was an administrative and forward planning gathering of just the IEOs and the ISG as the AP/Es had met previously and had working sessions with other leaders during the International RDE Summit in November.

Including the traditional comprehensive review of the international elections, the following items were also discussed - the concept of “YMI Open Houses”, (informal receptions hosted by clubs in their communities to share who we are and what we do with the general public); temporary reduced international dues for young people joining the organisation; establishment of a special “Centenary Celebration Team; and possible structural changes to the club de-chartering process and the Service Director model.



IPE Jacob introduced the key focus areas for his term sharing his GROW model for building and strengthening YMI, working with the other IEOs and consolidating his plan with the international agenda being developed by ISG Jose. GROW consist of “G” - Goals for his term, “R” – Reality or the current situation, “O” – Options for changing reality and reaching the established goals and “W” – Way forward, referring to the definitive action plan based on the options. The model consists in part of:



- Setting benchmarks and boosting teamwork
- Looking for the good stories of YMI activities and service to share

He also introduced his project idea, “Week 4 Waste” – an environmental programme in which club members would collect plastic waste (particularly in the sea) and general rubbish in cooperation with other entities - church, sports clubs, schools, community.

The IPE’s programme and membership goals were also reviewed and discussed.

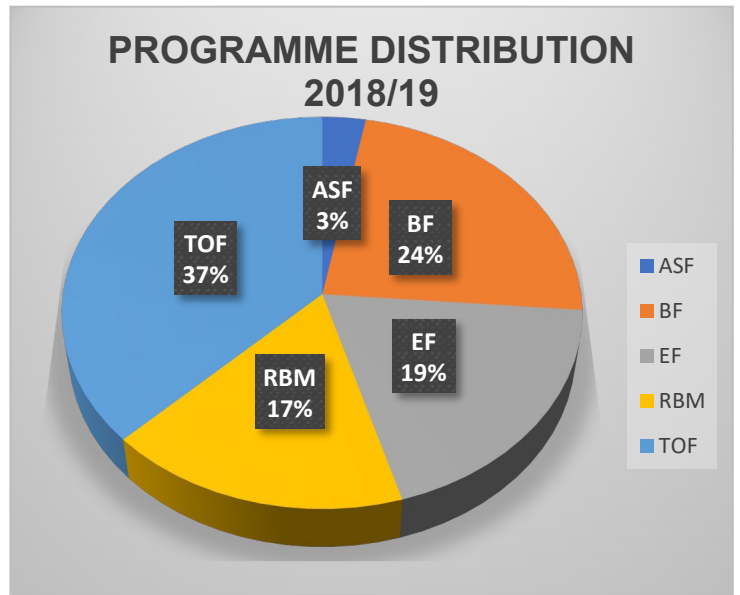
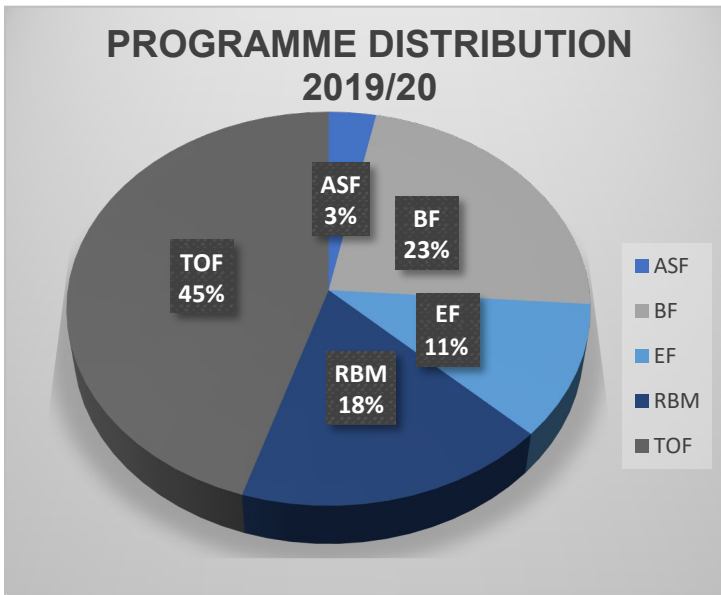
International Convention 2020 Cancellation

In April 2019, Within the context of the COVID-19 health crisis, the Danish Government prohibited all gatherings of more than 10 people until the end August 2020. Regrettably, this resulted in the cancellation of the 2020 International Convention and International Youth Convocation in Odense. The excellent planning and responsibility of the HC and ICC Committees, as well as Region Denmark meant no financial repercussions for the international organisation.

There were only four BF Cultural Exchange Grants approved in 2019/20. The European delegate to Africa successfully completed his full itinerary to Egypt and Nigeria and was able to attend the Africa Area Convention in September where he met not only African delegates but international participants as well.

The Asia Pacific Delegate to Latin America was able to partially complete his trip visiting Colombia but was sadly forced to cut his itinerary short and miss his visit to Peru due to the suddenly changing COVID-19 restrictions.

The two other approved trips (Latin America to Asia Pacific and Korea to Canada/Caribbean) are currently postponed indefinitely pending the evolution of the coronavirus and the eventuality of a return to safe and secure travel.

There were two Area Convention Grants. Both were cancelled due to the pandemic when the meetings were held virtually.

There was also a BF Area Support Grant which was approved for Extension work in Eastern Europe.

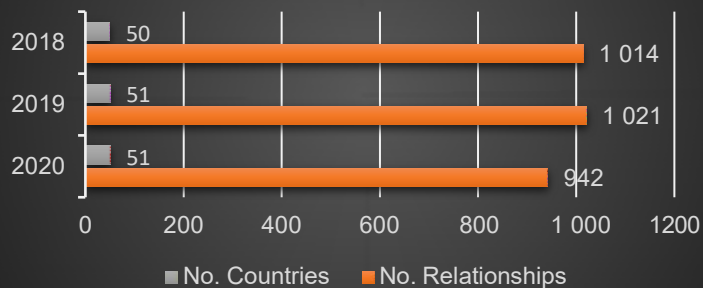

Thank you to the Columbia YMCA and the Y's Men's Club. And thank you for all the preparation of the Y's Men's Club in Peru.

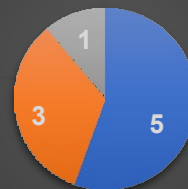

New IBC Relationships in 2019/20



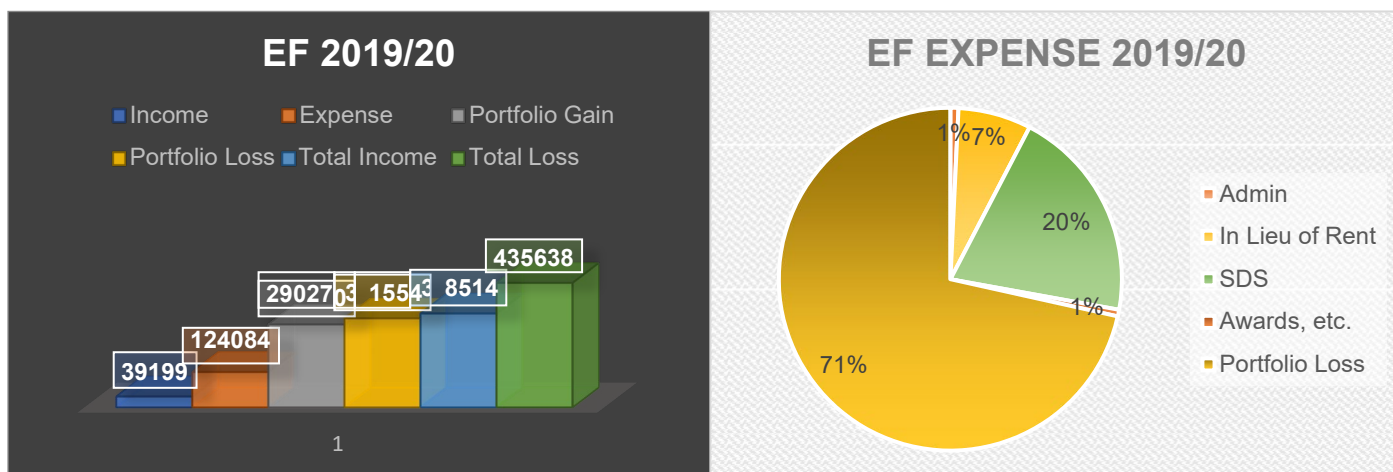

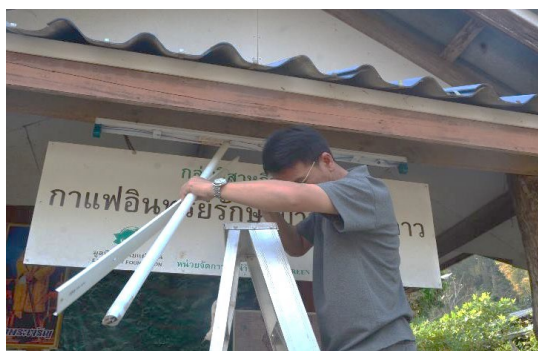
Green Projects

ICM 2019 approved the following carbon offset (green) projects focusing on lighting upgrades at local YMCAs and villages

- "Healthy Community & Green Nature in Low Carbon Society" in Chiang Mai, Thailand for CHF 5 000
- "Reduction of Carbon Emission (ROCE) Project" in Myanmar for CHF 2 675
- "Y's Menettes Renewable Energy Project (YMREP)" in Jamaica for CHF 6'19 (with a provision for an additional CHF 2 462 following the successful implementation of Phase I (installation of 3KW solar PV system)

The three projects were successfully launched during the year. Below are pictures from the Thai project.

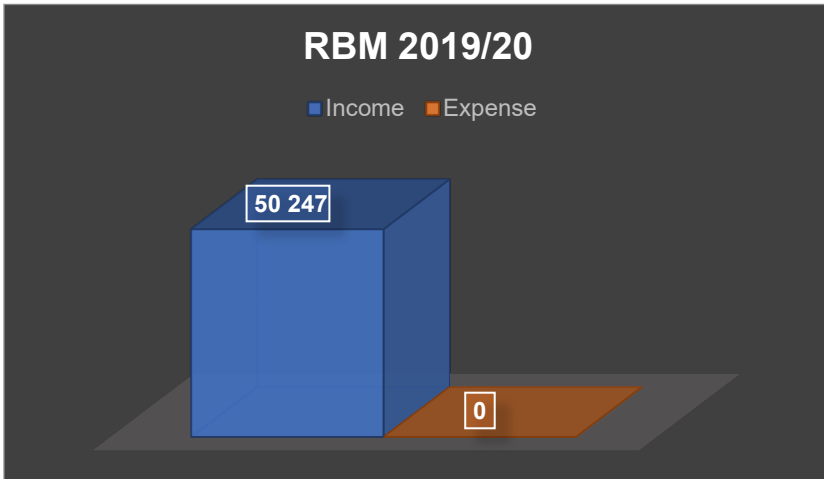
CHF 4 244 was also reserved for a solar PV project in Sri Lanka with the stipulation that funding shortfall needed to be covered before YMI funds could be released.

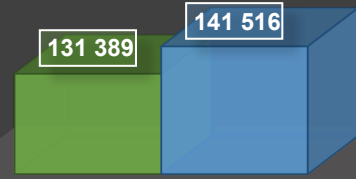
