Dear Youth leaders,

The International Youth Convocation 2018 (IYC18) is approaching soon at Yeosu, Korea! We are so excited to meet you again, or for the first time, as Youth Leaders. This time, it is so wonderful that the International Host Committee was able to establish a great relationship with Chonnam National University, who gave us the use of their Yeosu Campus and residence hall (dormitory) for IYC18. Although many youth are not able to attend IYC18 due to school or work, I know that you are working hard to represent your community at this Youth Convocation-with your Area's passion, support and prayers of course. It is our hope that you will bring back great knowledge and experience to share with others. There have been many discussions and debates on how important it is to take action re: the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) developed by the United Nations (UN). These are important goals to us as both Y's Men and citizens of this planet. At the IYC, you will also discuss the topic "Say No to Violence" which was started about ten years ago by the Y's Youth. Unfortunately, the world still faces so many occurrences of violence. We hope that the you will share many thoughts on this topic. The 16 SDG goals emphasizes peaceful and inclusive societies for sustainable development, and the provision of access to justice for all. According to UN records, various forms of violence against children persists, including discipline that relies on physical punishment and psychological aggression. With available data from 2005-2016, in 76 countries, about 8 in 10 children, from 1 to 14 years of age, were subjected to some form of psychological aggression and/or physical punishment on a regular basis. I wish you will have more information and concern on this issue and keep your friends and family protected.

At IYC18, you will also need to elect the next International Youth Representative (IYR). Your nomina-



tion and support to the candidate is very much needed to bring more youth into this Movement, and to strengthen working relationships with local or International branches of the YMCA. In the same breath, I would like to thank IYR Ricardo Andre Cardenas Zanabria for his two-year term, as well as the AYRs who will be welcoming their successors at future Area Youth Convocations. I especially want to thank the Editor of *Youth World Magazine,* Stephanie, for her work, and for coordinating the IYC programme with the 2018 IYC Host Committee and other youth facilitators. The 18th International Youth Convocation (IYC) is one of Y's Men International's most anticipated youth events. This year it will be held in the port-city of Yeosu, Korea, in the southern part of the country. It is the home of some of Korea's most significant historical events, and is the site of many beautiful natural and manmade attractions.

The following highlights a few fun facts about this great city. Read on!

Here are the facts:



Current day Yeosu was once two cities: Old Yeosu City and Yeocheon City. These two cities were merged together in 1998.



The population, as of 2011, is 295, 538.



Yeosu was the host city of the 2012 World Expo.



Dolsan Bridge, which connects downtown Yeosu to Dolsan Park is 450m long and has changing lights at night.



Typically, Yeosu has longer springs and autumns than other regions in Korea.



Gejang (marinated raw crab) is the region's traditional cuisine.

OULD YOU BE THE NEXT IYR

The International Youth Representative (IYR) position is an exciting opportunity to become 'the voice' of the youth of Y's Men International (YMI). The IYR best represents the youth of YMI by keeping in constant communication with senior and youth leaders and finding creative and applicable solutions to challenges faced by the youth.

Qualities of the IYR

- Have a strong command of the English language.
- Be a good communicator.
- Have a strong passion for youth and youth activities.
- Have time to do the job and do it well!
- Must be between the ages of 18-28 years.

IYR Election Procedure

- The IYR is elected by the participants at the International Youth Convocation (IYC).
- Applications and nominations from 'the floor' of the International Youth Convocation (IYC) are permitted.
- The voting is done by secret ballot .
- If a single candidate does not receive at least 50% of the vote, the balloting continues until one candidate receives 50% of the vote.
- The balloting is monitored by the Past Youth Intern and Past IYR under the supervision of the YRM (if present).
- Each Region represented at the IYC has ONE vote.
- The Youth Representative cannot be elected from the same Area two consecutive times. This means that if the outgoing IYR is from Area X, the incoming IYR cannot be from Area X a second time in a row.
- Each IYR nominee is given the opportunity to give a speech during the IYC. The election is held the next day and the winning candidate is introduced at the IC on the day following that.

How to Apply

If you have what it takes, apply for the IYR position today! You can fill out your own application forms and even apply for someone else (with their permission of course)!

Nominations are open from June up until Wednesday, August 8, 2018. The IYR Presentations and Election will be held on Friday, August 10, at the 17th International Youth Convocation in

Korea!

Unable to attend the IYC? No problem! Please send a one minute video outlining why you are suitable candidate for the position and what you hope to achieve throughout your tenure. Please send your video the day before the IYC election on August 10. Your video will be played immediately prior to the IYR Elections.
